The ADA has extended the date for its guidance to April 30, 2020. The guidance is to postpone elective procedures and **provide care for emergency patients in order to alleviate the burden that dental emergencies would place on hospital emergency departments**. Please use the attached algorithm flow chart to help determine cases that are urgent and emergent.

Additionally, Governor Noem has issued an Executive Order, in effect until May 2, 2020, that healthcare providers follow CDC guidance and prepare for the expected surge of patients needing health care services as a result of the COVID-19 disease. The CDC recommendations are that dental facilities postpone elective procedures, surgeries, and non-urgent dental visits, and prioritize urgent and emergency visits and procedures now and for the coming several weeks.
