"Choreographing the Perfect Maintenance Visit"



This Mental Health Continuum Model, created by the Mental Health Commission of Canada, has been the most popular topic in my presentations and counseling/coaching. As I work with dental clinics, dentists, office managers, and team members, I hear many concerns about mental health in themselves and in their coworkers. The pandemic complicated our lives. We are reinventing after chaos.

In partnering with the SD Dental Association, we are building a culture that encourages people to reach out for assistance at the yellow symptoms instead of waiting for orange or red. Sometimes,

we think that working harder will make it better, when in reality that often makes it worse. It reminds me of a quote by David Allen "We can do anything, but not everything." Sometimes we need to put down the cape, and invest time in ourselves and our priorities.

I am honored to be working with the SDDA and offering three free and confidential counseling and coaching sessions for ALL dentists, clinic managers, and team members across the state. Topics for counseling/coaching have included burnout, relationships, parenting, anxiety, decision making, work stress, and transitions. So far, I have worked with 21 dentists, clinic managers, and team members to find clarity, build a strategy, and enhance agility skills so that success AND wellbeing are common practice.

- Normal mood fluctuations

Common & Reversible Distress

- Nervousness, irritability

- Procrastination

INJURED

Significant Functional Impairment

- Anxiety, anger, pervasive sadness, hopelessness
- Negative attitude
- Recurrent intrusive
- thoughts/images
- Difficulty concentrating
- Restless, disturbed sleep
- Increased fatigue, aches and pain
- Fluctuations in weight
- Avoidance, tardiness, decreased performance
- Frequent alcohol consumption, binge drinking
- Struggle to control addictive behaviors
- Increase trouble/impact due to substance use

ILL

Clinical Disorder. Severe & Persistent Functional Impairment.

- Excessive anxiety, panic attacks, easily enraged, aggressive
- Depressed mood, numb
- Non compliant
- Cannot concentrate, loss of cognitive ability
- Suicidal thoughts/intent
- Cannot fall asleep/stay asleep
- Constant fatigue, illness
- Extreme weight fluctuations
- Withdrawal, absenteeism
- Can't perform duties
- Regular to frequent binge drinking
- Addiction
- Significant trouble/impact due to substance use

ACTIONS TO TAKE AT EACH PHASE OF THE CONTINUUM

- Focus on task at hand
- Break problems into manageable tasks
- Controlled, deep breathing
- Nurture a support system
- Recognize limits, take breaks
- Get enough rest, food, exercise
- Reduce barriers to help-seeking
- Identify and resolve problems early
- Example of personal accountability
- Talk to someone, ask for help
- Tune into own signs of distress
- Make self-care a priority
- Get help sooner, not later
- Maintain social contact, don't withdraw
- Follow care recommendations
- · Seek consultation as needed
- Respect confidentiality
- Know resources and how to access them

Sioux Empire Smiles

On Saturday, October 8th, 98 underserved children from the Sioux Falls area were able to receive free dental work thanks to *Sioux Empire Smiles*. The event is now in its eight year and was organized by the Southeastern District Dental Society.

Member dentists, allied staff, Spanish interpreters, hygiene and assisting students and pre-dent students all donated their valuable time and services to provide dental screenings, restorative treatments, cleanings, and education. In addition to the children treated during the event, several others were referred on for further care. Thank you to those dentists who agreed to treat these additional children! Several children will need general anesthesia. Avera has generously donated operating room time and anesthesia for these cases.

The Delta Dental Foundation again provided several staff support for the event. Promoting the event as well coordinating patients and securing post-event care was led by Jean Gross. Jean has been the link to the children, schools, hospitals, translators and other organizations throughout all eight years of the program.

For most events of this nature the single largest expense is renting the space. In the case of Sioux Empire Smiles, Children's Dental Center once again donated the use of their clinic. Other significant expenses including dental supplies, tent rental and food were funded through and endowment within SD Dental Foundation. The liability insurance was again covered by Professional Insurors. Delta Dental Foundation continued to provide staff support for the event.

The clinic was a rewarding experience for the organizers, volunteers and funders who came together with a common goal of providing dental care to underserved children who are unable to obtain care. The 2023 Sioux Empire Smiles event is tentatively set for Saturday, October 7. Please mark your calendars now and plan to participate!

LanguageLine Solutions

The news recently reported that students in the Sioux Falls school district speak 77 different languages. As SD continues to become more diverse, language can be a barrier to quality and efficient patient care. Section 1557 of the Affordable Care Act requires health care providers to provide access to individuals with no/limited English proficiency.

To help reduce communication barriers between South Dakota dental offices and their patients, Delta Dental of South Dakota subscribes to LanguageLine Solutions, a language interpretation service offering translators for over 240 different languages. This service is available to dentists/dental offices participating in the Delta Dental network and/or the SD Medicaid program.

LanguageLine is available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. Should you and a patient have a language barrier, you can simply call LanguageLine Solutions, request the language needed, and an interpreter will assist you and your patient in your communication. The best part is that this service is offered to you at no cost. Charg-

Businesses Invited to Partner with Incoming Dental Assistant Students

Last year, Dental Assisting was approved to participate in the Build Dakota Scholarship program, a full-ride opportunity for students pursuing high-need careers in South Dakota. The scholarship covers 100% of tuition, fees, books, tools/equipment and other required program items.



Industry partners cover a portion of the scholarship in return for the scholar's commitment to work

for the company for three years after graduation. Scholars also agree to maintain a 2.5 GPA and adhere to attendance and behavioral policies. Last year the Build Dakota Scholarship offered full-ride scholarships to 16 dental assisting students, 9 of those 16 had an industry partner.

Not only can Build Dakota Scholarships open the door to a pipeline of talented dental assistants into your practice, but participating in the program is also an affordable way to upskill your company's current workforce.

New, degree-seeking students of all ages can apply for the scholarship during the January 1 - March 31, 2023, application window. It is recommended that students be accepted by the technical college before applying for the scholarship.

Participating industry partners review applications and follow their typical hiring process to determine which student(s) may be a good fit for our practice. Scholars also sign contracts with the industry partner and Build Dakota which outline commitments by all parties, including repayment terms.
