Non-Licensed Persons Should be Reported

Several members have contacted the SDDA, reporting that they are aware of non-licensed individuals providing dental care to patients in South Dakota. The South Dakota State Board of Dentistry recommends that anyone with knowledge of a person without a dental license who is providing den-

tal care in South Dakota should alert local law enforcement (the local police department or county sheriff's department) and also make a report to the Division of Consumer Protection within the South Dakota Attorney General's Office. A Fresh Start for Future Smiles at Lake Area Tech

There's a buzz around Lake Area Technical College (LATC) — and it's not just the sound of dental tools. LATC is thrilled to announce progress toward launching its highly anticipated Dental Hygiene (DH) program, designed to meet the growing demand for skilled dental professionals in South Dakota.

Formally approved by the South Dakota State Board of Technical Education in May of 2024, the Dental Hygiene program is currently moving through the final step in the process: earning initial accreditation from the Commission on Dental Accreditation (CODA). Once granted, LATC will be ready to welcome its first cohort of students.

"Lake Area Tech has a reputation for producing skilled, workforce-ready graduates," said Tiffany Sanderson, LATC President. "The Dental Hygiene program is another incredible opportunity to meet South Dakota's growing healthcare needs and support our students' dreams in the dental field."

The Dental Hygiene Associate of Applied Science program will combine classroom learning, lab work, and clinical experiences totaling 1,207 contact hours, with 720 hours dedicated to direct patient care. Upon completion, graduates will earn an Associate of Applied Science (AAS) degree in Dental Hygiene and be eligible to sit for the National Board Dental Hygiene Exam – a key step toward state licensure.

Interest from students and dental providers has been strong, and excitement is building as LATC's Academic and Dental teams work closely with CODA to finalize accreditation.

"This program is designed with excellence in mind," shared Dr. Darlene Bogenpohl, EdD, RDH, Dental Hygiene Program Director. "Our goal is to develop confident, compassionate, and competent dental hygienists who will provide high-quality care across the region. The interest we've received confirms that this program is arriving at the right time."

To apply for the Dental Hygiene program, students must first complete a CODA -accredited Dental Assisting program, pass the Dental Assisting



National Board (DANB) exam to become a Certified Dental Assistant (CDA), and successfully finish all required prerequisite coursework.

The Lake Area Technical College Dental Hygiene program has already been approved by the Build Dakota Scholarship Board as an eligible program. This means qualified students will have the opportunity to earn a full-ride scholarship, covering tuition, fees, books, and more. It's an extraordinary opportunity that makes this high-demand, rewarding career pathway even more accessible and affordable for students who are ready to make a lasting impact in South Dakota communities.

The dental industry has a unique opportunity to support the next generation of professionals through the Build Dakota Scholarship program. By participating in the Stretch-the-Million (STM) partnership - modeled after LATC's successful LPN-to-RN initiatives - industry partners can sponsor students during their Dental Assisting education and, if desired, continue that support as they pursue a Dental Hygiene degree. Alternatively, partners may choose to invest in students specifically during their Dental Hygiene program, even if no prior sponsorship exists. This flexible approach allows the dental community to play a vital role in shaping a skilled and committed workforce.
